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China's nuclear buildup



- Three large silo fields discovered 2021-2022 (Yumen, Hami, Ordos)
- Approx 300 silos when finished
- Pentagon says 400 warheads in 2022, 1000 in 2030, 1500 in 2035
 - Not entirely sure of these estimates
- Why?
 - Decrease vulnerability, prestige, fuel, separate storage
- Fissile materials?

Political developments



- PLA modernization: Combat readiness 2017 -> 2027, structural modernization by 2035, "world-class force by 2049
- 20th Party Congress: "New phase" of military modernization
 - Appearance of focus on deterrence
- PLARF shake-up

US deterrence in Japan



- If Japan is drawn into US-China conflict, will nuclear weapons be involved?
- Nixon's secret agreement in 1972
- 2009: Akiba comments
- Japan slowly pushing for redeployment?
- Nat Sec advisor Akiba: Japan wants NATO-like arrangement
- Kanehara: US subs in Japan

Japan's role



- What will Japan's role be in a potential China conflict?
 - Military bases
 - Does the public know? Not widespread support
 - Takehara: "if they go they must use bases"

Narrative crafting

 If you build China up enough as a threat, it eventually becomes common sense that you must allow certain things that would previously have been non-starters
